Summary

During November 2018, Lindsay Bremner and John Cook accompanied twenty students in the DS18 studio of the MArch programme at the University of Westminster on a fieldtrip to Myanmar. The field trip was part of their one-year long studio programme on Myanmar titled 'Cosmopolitical Design in a Monsoonal River Basin.' The aim of the

fieldtrip was to give the students the opportunity to experience the social and environmental conditions they had been mapping prior to the field trip, to conduct primary research on their chosen research themes, to meet experts in the field and to enable them to develop more informed design briefs on return to London. The incorporation of the MArch level design studio into the Monsoon Assemblages research programme was undertaken as a way of training students in evidence-based design, testing design led strategies for the project and increasing its impact.
